BAMBOO SHOOT SECTOR BRIEF

Vietnam is the world's third-largest exporter of bamboo and the nation's bamboo processing sector is increasingly well-developed. Over the next five years, domestic consumption is expected to double and the global bamboo market is forecast to grow to USD 12.2 billion by 2029. Global demand and trade agreements such as the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership and the European Union - Vietnam Free Trade Agreement can be expected to drive yet further market growth.

CINNAMON SECTOR BRIEF

Vietnam is the world's fourth-largest cinnamon producer behind China, Indonesia and Sri Lanka, yet the leading cinnamon exporter in the world. The most commonly-grown cinnamon variety in Vietnam is cassia, a variety wellsuited to many Asian cuisines. A versatile commodity, cinnamon trees can be harvested for wood, bark and oil and processed into a range of products.
